General Information

Purpose: Chinese Christian Schools' Summer Program is designed for students:

- wanting to develop skills in core subject areas
- wanting to earn high school course credit. If you attend a high school **other than CCS** you must check with your school to confirm acceptance of these course credits.

Registration: Registration is done on a first-come, first-serve basis *by campus*. Complete the registration packet and return it to the school office along with your payment in full. After April 8th, a \$30 late registration fee will apply.

**Registration Packet includes: Registration Form, Emergency Information Form, Shuttle Request Form (if needed), Copy of latest Report Card/Progress Report.*

Attendance/Discipline: Consistent, regular attendance is required. Parents must give serious consideration to vacation plans before enrolling their child(ren) in summer session. For credit classes, no more than three absences are permitted in order to earn credit. Also, students will be expected to maintain a high level of discipline and respect in all Summer School activities. Disruptive students will not be tolerated and may be dropped from the program.

- *No School on Monday, July 4th*

Before School Program: Students may be dropped off in the morning as early as 7:00 AM at no additional charge, excluding June 15–21 and July 25–29 for those taking 6 week classes.

Extended Day Program: An extended day program is available for students from 3:30 PM – 6:00 PM. The cost is \$460 or \$22 per day for drop-ins. Snack is included. ****Extended Day Program is not available from June 15–21 and July 25–29 for those taking 6 week classes.**

Class Cancellation Disclaimer: Chinese Christian Schools will make every effort to provide all the courses and services listed in this brochure. However, we reserve the right to cancel any class or service listed due to lack of enrollment or circumstances beyond our control. If such a cancellation occurs, you will be notified immediately.

Terms and Conditions: All payments are non-refundable. No pro-rating of any fees or changes can be made due to student cancellations. Payments will be refunded if Chinese Christian Schools must cancel a course or service due to lack of enrollment.

Credit Classes: (applies only to middle and high school). Additional class and study sessions, assignments, and activities beyond the scheduled class meeting times may be required in order to fulfill course curriculum requirements. All six week courses can be for credit at CCS and possibly at other schools. It is the responsibility of the student to check with their own school.

Lunch Options: All **full day** students are eligible to purchase school lunches on a weekly basis. Menus and additional information will be provided with the summer school confirmation letter. ***Any student taking a 6 week course will have to make other lunch arrangements for June 15–21 and July 25–29.***

Transportation: Complimentary shuttle service is provided between our SL and Alameda campuses before, midday, and after school at the times indicated on the form. **** Shuttle transportation will begin on June 22 and end on July 22. Any student taking a 6 week course will have to make other transportation and lunch arrangements for June 15–21 and July 25–29.**

***Note: Middle School Only:** The last week will be a 4 day week due to an optional fieldtrip.

Middle/High School Course Descriptions

(4 week courses: June 22 – July 22)

Core #1 Class Choices

General Math (AL & SL - 4 weeks)

Review of multiplication and division of whole numbers, adding, subtracting, multiplying of decimals and fractions, number theory, ratios, proportions, and percents. This class is intended for students entering the 6th grade.

Pre-Algebra – Readiness (AL & SL – 4 weeks)

This class is intended for students entering the 7th grade who would benefit by strengthening fundamental math concepts. Pre-algebra will also be introduced. (Placement will be determined by Math Advisor.)

Pre-Algebra – Enrichment (AL & SL – 4 weeks)

This class is intended for students entering the 7th grade who are proficient in general math. This course covers expressions and equations, integers, basic operations with decimals and fractions, solving equations, and number theory. (Placement will be determined by Math Advisor.)

Algebra IA (AL & SL - 4 weeks)

This introductory course is intended for students taking Algebra I in the fall. The course will cover properties of real numbers, solving equations, inequalities and their graphs, exponents and polynomials.

Geometry IA (SL – 4 weeks)

This introductory course is intended for students taking Geometry in the fall. The course will cover properties between the relationship of angles and lines, as well as two column proofs.

SAT-Reasoning Test Prep – Writing (SL - 4 weeks, M, W, F)

Students will develop an understanding of the new writing portion of the SAT-I and enhance their skills in the areas tested and emphasized in the exam. This class is intended for high school students only.

SAT-Reasoning Test Prep – Math (SL - 4 weeks, Tu & Th)

Students will learn what skills are being tested in the mathematics portion of the SAT-I and develop those skills that will best prepare them. This class is intended for high school students only.

Study Hall (AL & SL – 4 Weeks)

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects.

Core #2 Class Choices

Middle School Grammar and Writing (AL & SL - 4 weeks)

This enrichment class will focus on the Writing Process and Strategies. It will reinforce a student's understanding of audience and purpose when writing, developing an outline and draft, developing a thesis statement, and proofreading strategies. Students will learn how to improve sentences and paragraphs to create more effective essays. Expository and persuasive writing will be the focused modes of writing. ***This enrichment course is based on a three year rotation. The actual curriculum changes yearly.***

Middle School Literature (AL & SL - 4 Weeks)

This enrichment class is designed to reinforce the key skills and strategies of Reading, Vocabulary development, and Literature. Students will review the Thinking Strategies, context clues, multiple meaning words, connotations, denotations, and focus on understanding how to read Nonfiction. Students will read a variety of nonfiction pieces such as essays, speeches, consumer documents, graphs, and subject text in areas such as science or history. ***This enrichment course is based on a three year rotation. The actual curriculum changes yearly.***

Middle School Conversational Mandarin (AL & SL – 4 Weeks)

This course is designed for beginning Mandarin students. It is ideal for students who have never taken Mandarin and for those who would like to strengthen what they do know. Conversation will be emphasized and Pinyin will be studied.

Middle School Conversational Spanish (SL – 4 Weeks)

This course is designed for beginning Spanish students. It is ideal for students who have never taken Spanish and for those who would like to strengthen what they do know. Conversation will be emphasized.

Study Hall (AL & SL – 4 Weeks)

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects.

High School Credit Course Descriptions

(6 week courses: June 15 – July 29)

Core #1 Class Choices (6 week courses)**Algebra IB (SL - 6 weeks)**

This class is intended for CCS students who struggled during the second semester of Algebra I and would like to make up the class or review the material that was taught.

High School English (SL – 6 weeks)

This class is for students who have a deficiency in fulfilling their high school English course requirements for graduation and college admissions. The course will be tailored to meet the needs of the students and will qualify under one of the school's UC-approved courses. Final approval from the Academics Advisor is needed to enroll. This course is intended for a student who has completed at least one year of high school.

High School US History A (SL - 6 weeks)

This class will fulfill the first semester of the U.S. History course requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide a historical overview of American history from its founding to about the Civil War. This course is intended for a student who has completed his sophomore year.

High School World History A (SL - 6 weeks)

This class will fulfill the first semester of the World History course requirement for high school graduation. It provides a survey of historical movements, trends, and events from Creation to the Reformation. This course is intended for a student who has completed his freshman year.

High School US Government SL - 6 weeks)

This class will fulfill the one-semester U.S. Government requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide an overview of the basic institutions of U.S. government and its constitutional underpinnings. This course is intended for a student who has completed their junior year.

Study Hall (SL – 6 Weeks)

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects

Core #2 Class Choices (6 week courses)**High School Geometry B (SL - 6 weeks)**

This class is intended for CCS students who did not do well during the second semester of Geometry and would like to make up the class or review the material that was taught.

High School Economics (SL - 6 weeks)

This class will fulfill the one-semester Economics course requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide an overview of basic economic and free market theories in the micro and macro settings. This course is intended for a student who has completed his junior year.

High School World History B (SL - 6 weeks)

This class will fulfill the second semester of the World History course requirement for high school graduation. Students will learn about historical events from about the Reformation to the present. This course is intended for a student who has completed his freshman year.

High School US History B (SL - 6 weeks)

This class will fulfill the second semester of the U.S. History course requirement for high school graduation. The course will provide a historical overview of American history from about the Civil War to the present. This course is intended for a student who has completed his sophomore year

Study Hall (SL – 6 Weeks)

Students will be supervised in a designated, quiet Study Hall room where they can do homework, study, work on upcoming projects

Enrichment Camps – (SL) 1:00 PM – 3:30 PM **Middle School Boys and Girls**

Note: The sports clinics are designed to help boys and girls develop a better understanding of the sport and develop their talent no matter what their current skill level.

June 22 – June 24 (3 days)

Bowling - Cost: \$60

Location: Manor Bowl (Includes 2 games and shoes each day)

June 27 – July 1 (5 days)

Golf – Cost: \$100

Location: SL Campus, Thurs – Driving Range, Fri – Miniature Golf

Rocketry – Cost: \$100

Students will build and launch model rockets, using specific kits that are fitted with small rocket engines. This course will develop the student's skills with detailed assembly and painting. By the end of the week, the student will be able to launch and keep their very own rocket.

July 5 – July 8 (4 days – no school on July 4th)

Tennis – Cost \$80

Location: Pacific Tennis Courts San Leandro

Photoshop Elements – Cost: \$80

Students will be able to creatively touchup and correct digital photographs using Adobe Photoshop Elements. Students will be able to create and share video photo slide shows of their favorite topic. In preparation for this course, students will need to collect photographs to bring to class, such as pictures from their last vacation.

July 11 – July 15 (5 days)

Basketball – Cost: \$100

Location: Alameda Campus

Robotics – Cost: \$100 (All materials included)

This class will have students building a VEX robot, assembled using erector set techniques. As time permits, students will learn how to program the robot to perform specific tasks or evade objects. Students will also participate in robot races and maze competitions, conducted at the end of the week.

Multi-Media Video Game Creation (2 sessions) – Cost: \$100

Part I – July 11 – July 15

Part II – July 18 – July 22

Students will be able to create and bring home a two-dimensional computer video game using an integrated program, called Fusion. Fusion is an easy-to-use game authoring environment that will allow the student to make wonderfully, creative games. It is an authoring tool that allows you to create many types of computer games, screensavers, educational programs, utilities or other applications, all quite easily.

July 18 – July 22 (4 days due to All Day outing; place and day to be determined)

Volleyball – Cost: \$80

Location: Alameda Campus

Cooking – Cost: \$80

This course will expose the students to the world of cooking. Students will start with simple baked goods, like cookies, and move to more advanced dishes. They will learn to cook from scratch, using provided ingredients.
