English I Honors Course Syllabus for 2010-2011

Course Description: English I Honors is a college prep course that will develop strong literary skills, by equipping the students to be critical thinkers, analytical writers, comprehensive readers, and articulate speakers. English Honors will read two novels *The Odyssey* and *To Kill a Mockingbird*, a play *Taming of the Shrew*, and several short stories in the *McDougall Littell Anthology*. Students will also be expected to do outside reading on AR books. Students will learn to write an analytical paper that will prepare them to build strong and persuasive arguments. They will learn the structure of an essay which includes a thesis, topic sentences, an introductory paragraph, supporting body paragraphs, and a conclusion. This course will require active participation in class discussion. Writing will be weighed the most in class, and a writing portfolio will be created to document students' work. In this course we will learn that literature reflects important historical perspectives, social reform, and most importantly, allusions from the Bible. We will learn literary devices to enhance our understanding of the novels such as figurative language, similes, metaphors, irony, and symbolism. Students need to complete their assignments on time and finish their readings prior to class.

Promptness and Preparation for class:

Rules for Written Work:

1. Needs to be in standard heading (name, date, class period, and type of assignment (e.g. test, quiz, timed write, etc.) on 8-1/2 by 11" paper, have **1" margins**, and in **font size 12, Times New Roman**.
2. All **Essays** -- rough drafts, finals drafts, and certain journal writes must be typed, double-spaced. Essay Heading must be in MLA format:

Instructor's name (Miss Jea)
Class information (English I)
Date (January 19, 2010)

3. Any assignments with illegible hand-writing will be returned, and need to be resubmitted. They will be counted as late work.
4. All essays, both rough and final drafts, must be submitted to **www.turnitin.com**. Essays not submitted will receive 50 percent credit maximum.

Late Work:

If a student is absent and misses an assignment, he or she is responsible to get the homework assignment. It must be turned in within **3 days** for any credit.

If a student misses an exam or quiz, he or she will have to schedule a make-up exam within **two days of their return**. Homework that is not complete at the beginning of the period will be counted as late work.

** Ten percent will be deducted per day for late assignments.
